thing whatever, or shall vend, give away, or otherwise dispose of any lottery tickets, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.

**258. Mock Auctions, Etc.] SECTION 47.** No person shall, within the limits of this City, set up any mock auction, or designedly by any false pretenses, devise, token or conspiracy, obtain from any other person or persons, any money, goods, chattels or other valuable thing. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this section shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall, in addition to the fine inflicted, be adjudged to return such money or property obtained as aforesaid.

**259. Night Prowlers.] SECTION 48.** Whoever, in the night time, shall prowl around or loiter in the vicinity of, or upon any private grounds or dwelling, or in any barn, shed, or outhouse, or peep in at any window or door of any private dwellings, or whoever shall be found prowling or loitering in any public or private place, or in the vicinity of any store or other business house; or roaming or loitering around on the streets, sidewalks, alleys or public places of this city after eleven o'clock P. M. except in transacting or going to or from some lawful place of business, amusement or other necessary and lawful pursuit, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.

**260. Obscene Literature. Etc.] SECTION 49.** Whoever shall, in any place of public view within this city, write, mark, draw, cut, carve or make any obscene, vulgar, lewd or indecent word, sentence, design, picture or figure; or shall exhibit, sell, or give away, or offer to sell or give away or shall have in his or her possession, with or without intent to sell or give away, any obscene and indecent book, pamphlet, paper, drawing, lithograph, engraving, picture, photograph, or view, or any instrument or article of indecent or immoral use, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.

**261. Obstructions on Sidewalks.] SECTION 50.** Whoever shall place any goods, wares or merchandise, boxes, or other obstructions on any sidewalk or footway in this City longer than for the time necessary in receiving, delivering or removing the same, or in any manner so as to obstruct free passage and use of any such walks by the public, or shall allow any sign, post, door, gate or other obstruction to so encroach or remain on any of said walks as to interfere with the use of same as aforesaid, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.

**262. Offal on Streets, Premises, Etc.]. SECTION 51.** Whoever shall throw, place or deposit, or allow to flow or run out of his or her premises, onto any street, alley, or sidewalk, or onto the premises of another person, any foul smelling matter, substance or liquid, or any offensive matter or refuse; or shall place, throw or deposit thereon any manure, urine, slops, refuse, trash or other waste matter or any dead

fowl or animal, or shall throw any slops, waste water, refuse or trash from any upper window onto any such street, alley or sidewalk, or premises of another person, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.

**263. Papers Not to be Removed Etc.] SECTION 52.** Whoever not the owner thereof, shall wilfully remove, steal, or carry away any newspaper, magazine, pamphlet or periodical which has been left or deposited in any yard, porch, doorway or other place of usual delivery to another person, or any mail matter left in any such place, or in any box belonging to another person, or shall remove or take away, from their proper office or place of custody any of the records, books or papers of the City Clerk, Police Magistrate or other officer of this City, without permission of any such officer or of the owner of any of the aforesaid papers, mail or other literature, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.

**264. Pigeons.] SECTION 53.** If any person owning any pigeons within the limits of this City shall permit the same to go at large and alight or sit upon any building belonging to the City or to any other person, persons, firm or corporation, whereby the water running off of said building into any cistern, tank or reservoir may be rendered impure, such owner or person permitting the same shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and be fined not less than three nor more than two hundred dollars.

**265. Posting Bills.] SECTION 54.** Whoever shall stick, paste, put up or place upon or against any building, wall, fence, tree, pole, post or other property belonging to another person within this City, without the consent of the owner, or upon any property belonging to the City or any school district, church, company or association, without such consent, any hand bill, show bill, picture, representation, or advertisement; or any person who shall so post within the limits of this City, with or without such consent, any immoral, lewd, obscene or indecent pictures, printing or writings, or any advertisement for the cure of so-called secret diseases in any place of public view shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.

**266. Rout.] SECTION 55.** If two or more persons shall meet to do an unlawful act, within this City, upon a common cause of quarrel, and make advances toward it, they shall be deemed guilty of rout, which offense is hereby declared to be a misdemeanor.

**267. Riot.] SECTION 56.** If two or more persons actually do an unlawful act with force or violence against the person or property of another, with or without a common cause of quarrel, or even do a lawful act in a violent or tumultuous manner, within this City, the persons so offending shall be deemed guilty of riot, which is hereby declared to be a misdemeanor.

**268. Selling Oil, Etc.] SECTION 57.** It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or deal in coal oil, naphtha, gasoline, benzine or other mineral oils which will ignite at a temperature of less than 150 degrees Fahrenheit, and it shall be unlawful for any dealer to sell any coal oil, gasoline, powder or other explosive by any candle or open light. Whoever violates any of the provisions hereof, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.

**269. Selling Weapons to Minors or Intoxicated Person.] SECTION 58.** Whoever shall, within the limits of this City, by himself or agent, sell, give, loan, hire or barter, or offer so to do, to any minor, or any intoxicated person any pistol, revolver, derringer, slung shot, cross knuckle, knuckles of lead, brass or other metal, bowie knife, dirk, dagger or other dangerous or deadly weapon or thing, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.

**270. Sidewalks Injured or Destroyed, Etc.] SECTION 59.** Whoever shall injure or tear up any pavement, side or cross walk, or any part thereof, or dig therein any hole, ditch, drain or vault, or dig or remove any sod, stone, earth, sand or gravel therefrom, and shall not arch, or cover the same over and secure the grating or covering of any opening in any such walk, in such a manner as to prevent persons, animals or vehicles from slipping or falling into the same, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.

**271. Sidewalks to be Kept Clean.] SECTION 60.** Whoever within the limits of this City, owns, possessess, rents or occupies any real estate, adjoining or in front of which there is any sidewalk in actual public use, shall fail within three hours after any snow storm, or after daylight, if at night, clean the side walk in front of their said property, and shall keep the same free and clear of snow and ice, and the front and along the side of such sidewalk clear of any rubbish, weeds, plants, or obstructions whatever that may in any way hinder the free drainage of any street or gutter, wherever such street is provided with stone guttering, and so such walks are free of such obstructions for use of pedestrians, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.

**272. Sling and Sling Shots.] SECTION 61.** Whoever shall use any sling or sling shot of any description or material, within the limits of this City shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.

**273. Spitting on Sidewalks, Etc.,—Prohibited.] SECTION 62.** Whoever shall expectorate any saliva, tobacco juice or other substance. or shall otherwise spit, spew or vomit upon any sidewalk, cross walk, fence, doorstep, entrance, hallway, stairs, platform, or upon the floor of any church, school, depot, hall, store room, or other place of business, worship or amusement open to and frequented by the public; or shall wilfully spit or vomit in or upon or otherwise defile or cut, mark

or deface any building, walk, shed, closet, or other premises, or any personal property of an other person, within the limits of this City, or shall spit, squirt, throw, place or mark any liquid, paint, soot or other substance upon the person or clothing of another, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and punished accordingly.

**274. Tearing<sup>a</sup> Down or Defacing Notices, Etc.] SECTION 63.** Whoever shall maliciously and wilfully tear down, mutilate, deface, cover up or render illegible, any notice, hand bill, advertisement or other poster lawfully posted in any street, alley or public place in this City shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.

**275. Throwing Stones, Etc.] SECTION 64.** Whoever shall wilfully within the limits of this City, throw or cast any stone or other missile upon or at any building, window, tree, fence, or other public or private property, or thereby wilfully break any window pane in any house, shed, barn or other building, or shall break or otherwise injure any lamp, post, wires, awnings, signs, ornamental or shade trees, shrubs, flowers, plants, or any property belonging to the City or any person, or shall throw at any person in any street, alley, avenue or place in this City, or shall wilfully and maliciously throw any stick, stone or other missile into any private premises, or therefrom into any street or public place in this City shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.

**276. Traction Engine in City.] SECTION 65.** Whoever shall run any threshing or traction engine upon any of the streets or alleys of this City, without sending a competent person one hundred yards ahead of such engine to warn people of the approach thereof, and to assist in clearing the streets of horses and teams and preventing damages, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.

**277. Trees, Shrubbery, Fruit and Flowers.] SECTION 66.** Whoever shall wilfully and unlawfully break, injure, destroy or carry away any trees growing on any of the streets, sidewalks, alleys or public places of this City, or in trimming same under permission of the City Council, shall unnecessarily mutilate or injure the same, or shall so injure destroy, molest or carry away any trees, fruit, vines, flowers or shrubbery of any private person, without the consent of the owner thereof, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.

**278. Vagrants and Vagabonds.] SECTION 67.** All persons who are idle and dissolute, and go about begging; all persons who use any juggling or other unlawful games or plays; runaways, pilferers, confidence men, common drunkards, common night walkers, lewd wanton and lascivious persons, in speech or behavior, common railers and brawlers; persons who are habitually neglectful of their employment or their calling, and do not lawfully provide for themselves, or

for the support of their families; and all persons who are idle or dissolute and who neglect all lawful business, and who habitually misspend their time by frequenting houses of ill-fame, gaming houses or dram shops; all persons lodging in or found in the night time in out-houses, sheds, barns or unoccupied buildings or lodging in the open air, and not giving a good account of themselves; and all persons who are known to be thieves, burglars or pickpockets, either by their own confession or otherwise, or by having been convicted of larceny, burglary or other crime against the laws of the State of Illinois, punishable by imprisonment in the state prison or in a house of correction of any City, and having no lawful means of support, are habitually found prowling around any railroad depot, banking institution, place of public amusement, store, shop, crowded thoroughfare, car or omnibus, or at any public gathering or assembly, or lounging about any livery barn or lumber yard, private dwelling house or outhouses, or are found in any house of ill fame, gambling house or dramshop, shall be deemed guilty of vagrancy, which is hereby declared to be a misdemeanor.

**279. Vehicles Turn to Right.] SECTION 68.** Whoever, while riding any animal, or driving or riding in any vehicle, upon meeting another animal or vehicle on any street, or alley in this City, fails to turn to the right, where there is room so to do, or shall carelessly ride or drive any such animal or vehicle so as to collide or strike any other animal or vehicle or person in passing, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.

**280. Penalty for Misdemeanor.] SECTION 69.** Any person, persons or corporation who shall violate or shall fail to keep and observe any of the provisions of this Chapter or of any section thereof, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall, upon conviction thereof, be severally fined not less than three nor more than two hundred dollars for each offense.

**281. Fines Worked Out, Unless Paid or Remitted.] SECTION 70.** Whoever fails or refuses to pay any fine or penalty, and costs, assessed against him, for violating any of the provisions of any of the ordinances of this City, shall be required to work on the streets, alleys, avenues or in the rock quarry or stone pile of this City, or at some other work suitable to his or her strength, not to exceed ten hours each working day; for which work they shall be allowed, exclusive of his or her board, the sum of fifty cents per day, for each day's work, on account of such fine and costs.
