## 1 - Introduction

## Inspection Profile:

On February 8, 2021 a team of Industry Operations Investigators (IOIs) arrived on premises to conduct a full Demand Letter II compliance inspection. The Team consisted of Lead IOI(b)(6) , in addition to IOIs(b)(6) (b)(6)
IOIS $(\mathrm{b})(6) \quad$. IOIS were present on premises for six (6) weeks conducting the inspection. At the direction of the Director of Industry Operations, in April 2021 and this time the team consisted of IOIs (b)(6) (b)(6)

## and(b)(6)

During the inspection Earl Westforth was identified and interviewed, in addition to all of his employees, to include:


Initially several employees refused to provide identification, and when IOI (b)(6) insisted several of the employees explained that they weren't employees, that they were volunteers. Eventually it was explained that they were drawing Covid unemployment benefits and didn't want those benefits impacted.

The period of inspection is February 9, 2020 through February 8, 2021. No advance notification was provided.

## Business Profile:

The business is a firearms dealership (including NFA) in addition to general shooting accessories and ammunition. The premises has a suburban location and is a brick and mortar retail premises.

In the past 12 months $($ b)(4) firearms were acquired. Of the acquired firearms,

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${ }^{[b)(4)}(14 \%)$ were used handguns and ${ }^{(b)(4)}(3 \%)$ were used long guns.
Approximately(b)(4) firearms were disposed of during the inspection period. The licensee is not a firearms wholesaler, nor do they participate in gun shows.

## Ownership and Control:

The business is a corporation in good standing. Earl Westforth is the sole corporate officer.

## Variance:

During the inspection it was discovered that it was the licensee's practice to store completed Forms in the storage building across the street. IOI immediately assisted Earl Westforth in submitting and receiving a variance to do so. See Attachments for approved variance.

4 - Acquisition \& Disposition (A\&D) Record - Inventory
A $100 \%$ inventory initially revealed a total of 1,022 firearms present and ${ }^{[\pi / 3)}$ open dispositions in the bound book. After a reconciliation occurred the licensee was cited for a violation of 27 CFR $478.125(\mathrm{e})$ for ${ }^{[00]}$ instances of failure to make the required acquisition and disposition entries in the Bound Book. Furthermore, on February 25, 2021, the licensee submitted an ATF F 3310.11, Federal Firearms Licensee Firearms Inventory Theft Loss Report documenting the loss of ${ }^{[0 / 3) T}$. firearms discovered during an ATF inspection inventory. See the attached Theft Loss Report for Incident


During the inspection period the licensee reported ${ }^{\text {[0] }}$ firearm thefts/losses involving a total of ${ }^{[0,3]}$ firearms. Initially the licensee reported the firearms as inventory losses as they were discovered during routine inventories. However, after reviewing video, the licensee began to suspect employee(b)(6) $\quad$ IOI(b)(6) spoke with the Lake County Sheriff Police Detective (b)(6) (b)(6) ) who explained that(b)(6)

 Detective(b)(6) explained that due to factors such as the backlog of court cases due to Covid-19 and the lack of serious criminal history of (b)(6) the Prosecutor would be dismissing charges. ## 5 - ATF Forms 4473 - NICS \& Other Dispositions

During the inspection period of 2/9/20 through $2 / 8 / 21$ the FFL completed
 all of the Forms was conducted by IOIs during the six weeks the inspection team was initially present at the premises. The following violations pertaining to the 4473 s were cited:

- 27 CFR 478.129(b) for ${ }^{[9]}$ instances in which the licensee failed to retain 4473s in which a NICS check had been completed.

- 27 CFR 478.21(a) for ${ }^{[\text {[ive }]}$ instances in which the 4473 instructions were not followed during the completion of the Form.
- 27 CFR 478.124(c)(3)(i) for instances in which the licensee failed to properly verify or document the purchaser's identification on the Form.
- 27 CFR 478.124(c)(4) for instance of the licensee failing to record the correct firearm information on the Form.
- 27 CFR 478.124(c)(3)(iv) for ${ }^{[\text {Pros }}$ instances in which the licensee failed to properly record NICS contact information on the 4473.
- 27 CFR 478.124(c)(5) for ${ }^{017}$ instance of the licensee failing to sign and date a 4473 documenting the transfer of a firearm.


## Failure to Retain ATF F 4473

During the inspection, $\operatorname{IOI}(\mathrm{b})(6)$ witnessed an employee rip up and discard two 4473 s for a combined transaction that the employees stopped due to it being a potential straw purchase when the two purchasers attempted to use the same credit card that was not in either of their names. IOI ${ }^{(b)(6)}$ recovered and reconstructed the 4473 s in question and immediately submitted a SAR in Spartan regarding the attempted straw by both (b)(6) and(b)(6) (in Spartan it was mistakenly submitted as an independent SAR, and not as part of the Westforth Inspection). IOI ${ }^{(b)(6)}$ questioned employees(b)(6) and(b)(6) who both explained that it was the store's practice to discard 4473s in which the transfer does not occur. When questioned Earl Westforth disputed their claim and said they never discard 4473s. In an attempt to determine if 4473 s were being destroyed, a $100 \%$ comparison was made between the NICS Audit Log and all available 4473's on

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premises.
The NICS Audit Log was run for the 60 days immediately preceding the initiation of the inspection and consisted of 1,732 denials (dating back to 1998) and 983 proceed/open NICS checks. Upon completion of the comparison (and reconciliation by the Licensee) it was determined that a total of 4473 's were unaccounted for (see ROV attachment). (b)(6) denied 4473 during the inspection period and 4473 s in the previous 60 days were unaccounted for, supporting the employees' statements that 4473 s were being discarded.

During the closing conferenced Earl Westforth explained that if any employees were incorrectly destroying 4473s, it wasn't at his direction and that he's addressed this issue with all employees and implemented a new procedure in which he is the only person who can determine what action can be taken with a 4473 in which a firearm doesn't transfer.

## Failure to Record NICS Contact Information on 4473

In April of 2021 a team of IOIs including(b)(6) $\quad$ with IOIs(b)(6) (b)(6) and (b)(6) were ordered to return to the licensed premises in order to re-examine the ${ }^{2,373 \mathrm{~s} \text { on hand for the inspection period. }}$ Specifically, to inspect all NICS delayed firearm transfers in order to ensure that no prohibitive firearm transfers occurred. This resulted from the practice of the licensee to not consistently record on the 4473 the NICS delayed responses. See Attached ROV for the ${ }^{[0,0]]}$ instances in which delayed responses on the 4473s were not recorded as required.

The team of IOIs at the premises would scan all 4473's in which an initial NICS "delay" response was received, then email the Form to a team of IOIs (b)(6) (b)(6) and IOIS(b)(6) (b)(6) working remotely, for criminal background checks to be run. After 4 days back at the premises the IOIs were instructed to cease this aspect of the inspection primarily due to 2 factors:

1. A $100 \%$ verification of the NICS Audit Log to the 4473 s on hand for the inspection period already verified that no prohibitive firearm transfers occurred as the result of an unrecorded delayed NICS denial.
2. When questioned Earl Westforth explained the following:

- At any given time, there is a pile of $40-504473 \mathrm{~s}$ in a pile for which an initial NICS delayed was received.
- All purchasers who received a NICS delay were instructed to return after three business days elapsed in order to pick up their firearms.
- If a NICS delayed denial was received, they'd take the Form out of the delayed pile and move it to the Denied Folder.


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- Any NICS delayed proceed would be ignored, the customer would not be contacted, and the Form would not be updated.
- When a customer returned after three business days, and their 4473 was still in the delayed pile, they knew that the customer was not prohibited, and they could transfer the firearm.
- Westforth's didn't care if a delayed proceed was received or if three days elapsed without receiving a NICS response. Either way they believed it was legal to transfer the firearm. Ensuring that the ultimate NICS response was properly documented on the 4473 was a low priority for them when compared to ensuring that no prohibited individuals received a firearm.
- This approach was adopted in response to the Covid-19 increase in firearms sales. Earl Westforth explained that they got so busy that there were customers lined up out of the store, across the parking lot, and down the block. They actually had to severely reduce their business hours in order to leave enough time in the day to catch up on updating the records as required.


## 6 - Multiple Sales

During the inspection period, the licensee reported
 involving ${ }^{0,0}$ firearms (see the attached ROV). While several multiple handgun sales were not caught by the licensee and therefore unreported, the majority of these instances involved transactions in which the licensee completed the required Multiple Sale Form and attached it to the corresponding 4473 s , but the transactions were not included in the VCAB report. The licensee was afforded the opportunity to show proof that the Multiple Sale Reports were properly submitted, and in instances where proof was provided the licensee was instructed to resubmit the Form and no violation was cited.

The licensee explained that they still submit the Reports via fax, and the particular machine that they use has no verification upon completion of a successful fax therefore it was possible that some faxed reports did not go through, but they erroneously believed that they had. IOI(b)(6) noted that the licensee has computers present that were connected to the internet and had email capability. The IOI urged the licensee to complete the Multiple Sales Report electronically and submit them via email, which would generate proof of submission which could then be saved. Instead, the licensee had chosen to purchase a new fax machine which could generate a successful fax completion report, which would then be attached with the Report to the corresponding 4473. All unreported multiple sales Forms were immediately submitted/re-submitted.

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## 7 - Suspicious/Prohibited Purchasers

One of the primary purposes of this inspection was to look for potential traffickers and to forward the information developed to ATF Criminal Enforcement. Several steps were taken towards this goal:

- The Chicago Director of Industry Operations (DIO) Tom Arnold requested that special attention be paid to purchasers with firearms recovered in Chicago (across the border into Illinois) and involved in violent crimes.
- Prior to the inspection ATF Analytics was used to develop a list of 50 suspicious purchasers to initially focus on during the inspection.
- Out of the initial team of IOIs inspecting (b)(6) two IOIs (b)(6) and (b)(6) ) were tasked with developing referrable information on suspicious purchasers. They would run JWIN on the purchasers and firearms, they would also run Etrace and Accurint when needed.
- During the review of the 4473's on hand, when an IOI developed additional suspicious purchasers, the information would be passed to IOIs (b)(6) and (b)(6) for further development and tracking.
- The Merrillville Resident Agent in Charge (RAC),(b)(6) , tasked two Merrillville Special Agents, (b)(6) and(b)(6) to work with $\operatorname{IOI}(\mathrm{b})(6)$ During the inspection $\operatorname{IOI}(\mathrm{b})(6)$ met with Agents (b)(6) and(b)(6) and presented all of the suspicious purchasers and information developed. It turned out that the names presented were already known to the Agents (or other Chicago Criminal Enforcement groups). Therefore only 5 SARS were ultimately submitted, and those were simply to provide information on additional firearms purchases that the suspicious purchasers had made that the Agents were unaware of.

It is estimated that in excess of 200 criminal histories were run in JWIN with no prohibitive hits. Furthermore, all 141 used firearms in inventory were also run through JWIN and Etrace with no hits.

## 8 - Trace Activity

According to the Violent Crime Analysis Branch (VCAB) Master Query, the licensee was associated with ${ }^{[0: 3) T I I T}$ firearms trace requests during the inspection period, with (b)(3) - 112 Public Law 55125 Stat 552 addition to ${ }^{\text {Dup }}$ During the inspection IOIs submitted ${ }^{(1)}$ trace corrections to the NTC . Factoring in the ${ }^{[0,0)}$ Trace Completions, the adjusted number of traces with which the Licensee is associated with is actually ${ }^{\text {devin }}$ crime gun traces. See attachments for the corrected and completed traces.

Name: Westforth Sports Inc Trade Name:<br>UI\#: FCI-15480<br>FFL\#: 4-35-089-01-3B-37399<br>\section*{9 - NFA/Importer/Collector/Manufacturer}<br>The Licensee does not perform Importing, Collecting or Manufacturing activities, but they do pay the SOT as a Class III dealer in NFA firearms and an NFA inventory is maintained at the store.

## (b)(3) - 26 USC 6103

In April the Licensee, Earl Westforth, notified IOI(b)(6) that he was no longer acquiring firearms, and once his current store inventory was depleted that he was closing the doors and going out of business. Mr. Westforth explained that his only problem was with his NFA inventory; that the time involved with the Form 4 transfers would delay his going out of business. IOI(b)(6) contacted the NFA Branch and eventually it was approved to expedite these transfers in order to ease the transition and so that the SOT for 2022 would not need to be paid for. In June of 2021, Earl Westforth explained to IOI(b)(6) that he changed his mind, he paid the 2022 SOT and was acquiring more NFA firearms.

## 10 -Referrals

During the inspection, suspicious purchaser SARS were submitted on five (5) individuals.


Outside of the Westforth inspection in Spartan, a SAR was also submitted on (b)(6) and(b)(6) after their attempted straw purchases were stopped by the store employees and then the 4473 s were ripped up by employees and thrown in the trash. In an effort to determine whether more 4473s were being destroyed a $100 \%$ comparison from the 4473 s to the NICS audit log revealed a


A referral was submitted to Area Supervisor, (b)(6) , of the PA Field Division, Lansdale ATF Office, requesting that the Witmer Public Safety Group Inc, DBA: The Officer Store, be inspected for possible inclusion in the Demand Letter II Program. [0, turned out to be untraceable by the NTC. When on premises, IOIs completed these ${ }^{\left[{ }^{[0, s]}\right]}$ traces and forwarded the information to the Lansdale Office.

An additional halted straw sale occurred with IOIs on premise during the inspection. (b)(6) attempted to purchase a Century Arms AK47, serial number

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(b)(6) 7.62 caliber rifle. When she didn't have enough money to pay for the firearm, she stepped out into the parking lot. An employee followed her out and when the driver of a mini van passed her cash, the employee witnessed it and halted the transaction. The partially completed 4473, a picture of the minivan and a narrative of the event were immediately emailed to Agents (b)(6) and(b)(6) but no official SAR was submitted.

During this inspection the FFL was very busy. The parking lot was always full and numerous customers were always present at any given time. There were always vehicles present with out of State, Illinois, license plates. There were also frequent groups of young men viewing firearms with a single female present in the group. It became such a constant distraction to IOIs that based on prior guidance given to IOIs inspecting this licensee, $\operatorname{IOI}(\mathrm{b})(6)$ informed the inspection team to focus on the tasks at hand because if transactions were disrupted the licensee would have grounds for a harassment claim. Updated guidance from the Chicago Field Division advises IOIs to call into the Merrillville Field Office for a decision to be made as to whether or not an Agent should be sent out to assist.

## 11 - Other

During the inspection, while IOIs were on premises, the FFL was sued by the City of Chicago due to the fact that many of his firearms end up in Chicago and involved in violent crime. The licensee was concerned that there was a connection between the lawsuit and the ATF inspection, and that ATF was sharing past and present inspection information with the parties that he was being sued by. IOI(b)(6) repeatedly assured Earl Westforth that ATF was not party to the lawsuit, nor were his inspection findings being provided outside of ATF. IOI(b)(6) even explained that he refused to read the lawsuit or watch any media concerning the lawsuit as he did not want any factors influencing his recommendation other than evidence developed during the inspection. Earl Westforth and his employees repeatedly try to get comments/admissions about the lawsuit from IOIs, but IOIs continually refused to even discuss the topic. During the closing conference held with the Licensee on August 12, 2021, the Attorney representing Westforth in the lawsuit, Timothy R. Rudd, was present and participated.

In April of 2021, Earl Westforth stated to $\operatorname{IOI}(\mathrm{b})(6)$ that he was going out of business. He explained the following:

- (b)(6)

As he received the business from his father who started in approximately 1955, it was always his dream to likewise pass everything to his Sons.

- Because he had no one to leave the business to, he actively began to seek out a purchaser for the business so he could retire.

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- Because of the new lawsuit, his business has become radioactive, and he'd never be able to sell it now.
- (b)(6)
- He has notified his suppliers/ wholesalers that Westforth's is no longer acquiring firearms, and he ceased purchasing used firearms from customers.
- Once his current stock of firearms was depleted, he'd shut his doors and simply allow the store to sit, unused. Once the Chicago lawsuit was resolved, he would again try to sell the business, but he'd never again operate an FFL.
- He was also disposing of all of the NFA firearms and not renewing his SOT come June.

In June Earl Westforth explained to IOI(b)(6) that he decided to renew his SOT and acquire more NFA firearms.

During the closing conference at the licensed premises, IOI(b)(6) noted that it appeared that the store's firearm inventory had grown. Earl agreed and said that it had. When asked about his plan to stop acquiring firearms, Earl responded that of course he was still acquiring firearms from his wholesalers. It was internet transfer firearms from non-licensees that he stopped receiving.

noted that it was prior to the store opening for the day and no customers were present.

## 12-Closing Actions

The closing conference was held on August 12, 2021 at the licensed premises. Present were the Licensee Earl Westforth, his Attorney Timothy Rudd, and IOI(b)(6)
(b)(6) The Report of Violations (ROV) citing nine (9) violations was reviewed. Several of the violations were repeat. Earl Westforth signed the ROV and the document was scanned into Spartan, the original was provided to Earl Westforth.

IOI(b)(6) then conducted the review of regulations, which was signed by both IOI (b)(6) and Earl Westforth. The signed Acknowledgement of Regulations was input into the Spartan system and the original was provided to Earl Westforth.

I realize that's a fairly long time period.
6 A. Okay. Well, going back, they were always happy setting up stings on our store because the store has a beautiful layout for it, and customers felt very comfortable with us. We were told by many of -- different people that we're not racist here. Just because they're shopping in the aisles, there's nobody staring at you. So they knew that everybody was comfortable, and they spent a lot of time there.
Q. "They" being ATF?
A. ATF.

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1 Q. How many different times has ATF conducted a sting in your

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Article II, Part E Rule 207, Signing and Filing Depositions

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(a) Submission to Deponent; Changes; Signing. The deposition may then be used as fully as though signed, unless on a motion to suppress under Rule 211(d) the court holds that the reasons given by the deponent for a refusal to sign require rejection of the deposition in whole or in part.
(b) Certification, Filing, and Notice of Filing. (1) If the testimony is transcribed, the officer
shall certify within the deposition transcript that the deponent was duly sworn by the officer and that the deposition is a true record of the testimony given by the deponent. A deposition so certified requires no further proof of authenticity (2) Deposition transcripts shall not be filed with the clerk of the court as a matter of course. The party filing a deposition shall promptly serve notice thereof on the other parties and shall file the transcript and any exhibits in the form and manner specified by local rule.
